Gramma's Pecan Pie

Ingredients

- 1 cup light corn syrup
- 1 cup packed dark brown sugar
- 3 eggs slightly beaten
- 1/3 cup butter melted
- 1/3 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup pecans
- 1 unbaked pie crust



Instructions
